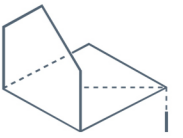

Activities E1 and C1 are open to the general public, while activity M1 is planned for consortium members. This Event will be hosted by the University of Belgrade – Faculty of Architecture, supported by all participating Higher education institutions, and will be organized online via the Zoom platform.

The first Multiplier event, HERSUS Intro Presentation, is planned in the sense of dialogue meeting, bringing together associate partners of HERSUS, as well as the wider professional and academic community. Within this activity, general information about the consortium members will be provided along with the presentation of the HERSUS research aims and intellectual outputs.

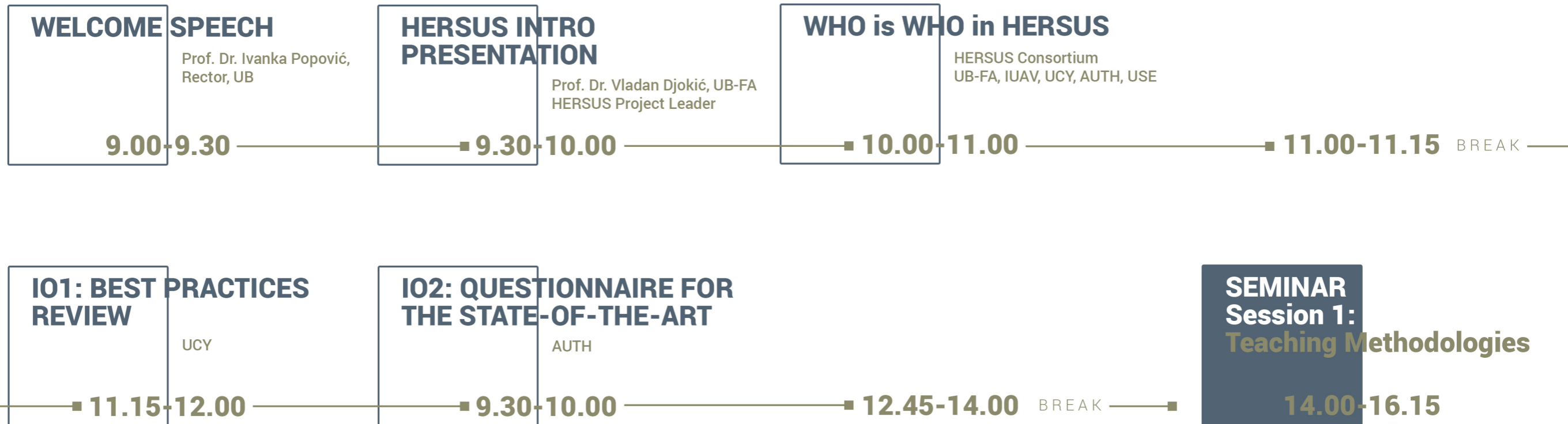

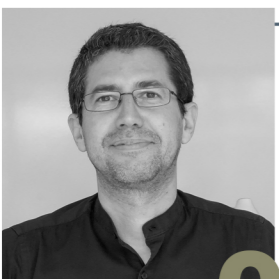
